

Milkweed of New Hampshire

8 species recorded. USDA zones 3b-6a. Monarch flyway: eastern. Sow seed outdoors late October to early December.

Native species

- ☐ **Swamp Milkweed**
Asclepias incarnata - 3ft-5ft - pink, rose, white - June to September - Wet/Average soil
- ☐ **Butterfly Weed**
Asclepias tuberosa - 1ft-3ft - orange, yellow, red - May to September - Dry/Average soil
- ☐ **Purple Milkweed**
Asclepias purpurascens - 2ft-4ft - purple, magenta - May to July - Average/Dry soil
- ☐ **Poke Milkweed**
Asclepias exaltata - 3ft-6ft - white, green - June to July - Average soil
- ☐ **Common Milkweed**
Asclepias syriaca - 3ft-6ft - pink, mauve, white - June to August - Dry/Average soil
- ☐ **Whorled Milkweed**
Asclepias verticillata - 1ft-2.5ft - white, green - June to September - Dry/Average soil
- ☐ **Clasping Milkweed**
Asclepias amplexicaulis - 1.5ft-3ft - pink, green, mauve - May to July - Dry soil
- ☐ **Fourleaf Milkweed**
Asclepias quadrifolia - 1ft-2ft - pink, white - May to June - Dry/Average soil
